Town of Ferryland in the Southern District of the
Island of aforesaid Widow of the one part and Thomas
Lackey of the same place Shoemaker of the other part,
Whereas by a Bill of Sale or Indenture bearing
date the eighth day of June in the Year of our Lord
one thousand eight hundred and nineteen and
made or supposed to be made between Michael
Soice of Ferryland Fisherman of the one part
and Lydia Goff of the same place Widow and party
to these presents / of the other part, the said Michael
Soice for good and sufficient considerations
therein mentioned that is to say for the sum of
Twenty pounds Sterling had bargained sold
set over and delivered over to the said Lydia Goff
from hence forth for ever All and Singular his
